

Documentation on Mandatory use of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) for Water-Jetting \geq 500 bar

Scope of Application:

Operators and technicians working with high-pressure water jetting machines, especially with pressures from 500 bar and above.

Legal and Standardization Framework

- 1) EN 1829-1:2021 — High-pressure water jet machines — Safety requirements
 - Covers machines with a working pressure exceeding 35 MPa (350 bar).
 - Specifies strict safety requirements, including protective measures for operators against hazards caused by high-pressure water projection.
- 2) Machinery Directive 2006/42/EC
 - Requires employers and manufacturers to assess risks and implement protective measures for the health and safety of workers, including the provision and use of PPE where necessary.
- 3) EN 60335-2-79:2012 — High-pressure cleaners (up to 35 MPa)
 - Covers lower-pressure equipment (up to 350 bar), where PPE use is recommended; however, for higher pressures the safety requirements are significantly stricter.
- 4) PPE Directive 89/686/EEC (now Regulation (EU) 2016/425)
 - Sets the standards for PPE and certification requirements, especially for equipment protecting against high-pressure hazards.

Safety and Protection in Water Jetting \geq 500 bar

- At pressures from 250 bar and above, the risk of injury becomes significant, with the risk of water injection into the skin increasing exponentially with pressure.
- At 500 bar and above, the hazard is critical, and without proper protection, serious injuries or fatalities can occur.
- The use of protective suits, gloves, eye/face protection, safety footwear, and hearing protection is essential and mandatory.

Conclusions and Recommendations

- The use of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) is mandatory when operating water jetting machines at 500 bar and above, in line with EN 1829-1:2021, Machinery Directive 2006/42/EC, and PPE Regulation 2016/425.
- Failure to use PPE in such conditions exposes the operator to serious health and safety risks, in violation of EU legislation and safety standards.
- It is strongly recommended to use certified PPE specifically designed to withstand high-pressure water jetting, such as protective clothing made for 500 bar or higher.
